Letter from Pastor Michelle

Through the Night of Doubt and Sorrow (hymn verse 1)

Through the night of doubt and sorrow, onward goes the pilgrim band, singing songs of expectation, marching to the promised land. Clear before us through the darkness gleams and burns the guiding light; pilgrim clasps the hand of pilgrim stepping fearless through the night.

This hymn written in the mid 1800s, still resonates with many people today, especially during this time of year. We all are traveling together through this winter season, through the Church season of Lent, and for many of us through a season in our lives of sorrow and doubt. The pilgrims clasp each other's hands as they keep moving through the night following a light to the promised land. Over the last few months I have heard many expressing sorrow and grief over the loss of our beloved friends and family that have been part of our church for decades, members in this community, and our family members. Phil and I personally in our family and friends outside of Grays Harbor have experienced unexpected loss. We feel your pain. We walk with you through this.

Not only have I heard loss of loved ones, but fear and uneasiness about fear in our nation right now. So what are we to do when facing personal grief and loss? What are we to do when facing such deep sorrow and fear? Grasp each other's hands as a community and walk together. To hold our memories close and love each other more. To give grace to each other when we speak out of the pain of our grief. To remember we have our community to move together through the night of doubt and sorrow toward the promise land. And to remember at a time such as this we are not alone. We move together toward Easter. Toward the promise.
