Letter from Pastor Michelle

Years ago I remember sitting in the movie theater and watching Mel Gibson's The Passion of the Christ—all the guts, gore, hate, and violence within that depiction of the passion of our God. Regardless of how dysfunctional Mel Gibson is and his horrible choices and things he has said in his life—that movie he made was moving. Probably one I would not necessarily want to watch again, but it was moving. What got to me after all those hours in that theater was the last two minutes of the movie.

That is what stuck with me as a teenager. The tomb opening. The rock being pulled away...and then the camera captures the pile on linen clothes he was wrapped in...and there is Jesus sitting there meditating...the light pours into the darkness and he walks out of the tomb. Black screen. The movie ends. Credits roll.

The beginning of a new world. A new life. A new hope. After all that pain and suffering—including suffering through this movie—we are pointed as the audience to see this is just the beginning of something new. Every year we go through the liturgy and the church year. We celebrate Christmas, travel through Lent, worship through Holy Week, and arrive at Easter. We have arrived at Easter. There is nothing after that—right?! We forget after Easter we have the birth of the CHURCH, the Holy Spirit coming down on Pentecost, and so much more. And Easter in an entire season—its like over a month long!

We have stories of Jesus meeting disciples on the road to Emmaus, Jesus feeding the disciples on the shores of Galilee, and his ascension into heaven. Easter every year is not the ending and "ok I guess I don't need to go to worship anymore until the fall" but the beginning. The beginning of so much more—of a new way of life and a new world. How many of us actually know in detail what happens after the resurrection with the early church? This is our heritage we need to know it!

Recently, I heard an interview where a cookbook and lifestyle author said, "Life is not really short. It is long and we always have room to improve and to change." Every year we get to Easter—remember that Christ rose from the tomb—and every year do we let that story change us? Do you see it as an ending to the story...or a beginning? Our lives are not set in stone. God calls us to always be open to new beginnings and willing to change. What in your life is holding you back to answer God's call to follow? What tomb are you "stuck" inside? How is God calling you to come out into the light—to leave the cave and enter into a new beginning of your life?
