Dear Ekklesia,

Wait why am I calling you all *Ekklesia*? *Ekklesia* is the Greek word in the New Testament that we take the word "church" from. The word *Ekklesia* from the time of the early church has been defined as, "a gathering of citizen called out from their homes into some public place, an assembly" or even another definition, "the whole body of Christians scattered through the earth." Reread those definitions again and let it sink in.

We are the church. The church is NOT in a building. I have seen some thinking worship is not happening right now, because we are not gathered in the sanctuary or church is "on hold." It is not. We need to really dive into the ancient meaning of church to see it is still happening. Even though worship is happening online we are still "gathering together" in a public space (on the internet). In addition, we are part of the church body that is scattered through the earth—there are Christians all over the world and we are united with them.

Now this idea of church being the people is rooted in our Protestant tradition. Presbyterians and Lutherans historically have fought against the idea of idol worship and that includes a space being used as an idol. Idolatry is when an image or object is worshipped. This connects with the idea of adiaphora. In the Lutheran Confessions adiaphora are "customs/things that are not necessary." Also, in Calvin's Institutes in chapter 11 he explains in detail why idols are against everything biblically. And the founder of modern-day

Presbyterianism John Knox went after idolatry and how we need to not be focused on things. So why am I writing this? The history and cultural foundations of both traditions of Lutheranism and Presbyterianism...which are part of Protestantism have set us up for a time such as this. We can pivot. We can change. We are not called to hold onto things of this world—customs that we think must happen for worship to happen. God calls us to gather in whatever capacity to worship God. That doesn't mean we have to do it the same way every time. Did you know there is no place whatsoever in the Bible or Confession/Institutes where it says communion should happen every week? Did you know gathering in a home with our family for worship is closer to what the early church was like? Think about it. The early Christians secretly had to meet in their homes or other gathering places—like the catacombs in Rome. They did not have buildings as houses of worship to gather at first. We are experiencing life so differently right now having to gather online or talk from a distance with each other. We are gathering, dear church! Even as we, the church, are scattered across the earth.

Someone pointed out to me a few weeks ago the blessings of technology. Twenty-five years ago, we would not be able to gather like we have for worship. I barely would be able to record something and send it out via email and maybe that would have not happened. It probably would only be a transcript of a sermon or a prayer. We are blessed that we can, right now, in the midst of this pandemic, still be connected and see each other's faces via technology. It would have been more isolating than in the past. Amid all this we are being blessed that we can gather virtually and stay safe.

Trust me, I would rather be in person right now if there wasn't a pandemic going on. I would love not having to work all these hours of editing and get human to human contact, but that is not safe right now. It is not safe for my family or for each of you. I would be devasted if because of gathering someone got ill. I am called to be your pastor and good steward of you, dear church. Therefore, sadly we cannot gather in our building right now, however we are still living into our call to "love our neighbors" by protecting each other from what can be a deadly virus.

Thanks be to God that we are the church that is not about a place but about the people. Thanks be to God that we have the freedom to change customs and not have idols to cling to. Thanks be to God that our faith is grounded in the Word of God. Thanks be to God for each of you still reaching out and connecting with one another. Thanks be to God for inspiring humans to create things like technology.

During such a time as this stay safe church. Know that I pray for each of you every day, and that Jesus is walking with you during these unknown times.

Church Council News

The church council, along with Pastors Michelle and Jeani, held our regular Zoom meeting on June 14.

One item we discussed concerned the funds we received in April from the US government Payroll Protection Plan under the CARES Act. The funds have now been used as required, and we are currently beginning the process of applying for the loan forgiveness. We expect to complete that application in July.

As you all may recall, Pastor Michelle received a wonderful grant to use for her sabbatical which was to start this July and end in October. Because of the Covid-19 pandemic, many of her planned retreats and activities have been cancelled. Also, there are current travel restrictions and quarantine requirements which would affect her sabbatical plans. Pastor Michelle asked the council for approval to postpone her sabbatical one year. The council voted to allow the change of dates, so the sabbatical will now begin in July and end in October 2021. And, I suspect we are all rather happy to have both Pastor Michelle and Pastor Jeani working together in the coming months, to lead and guide us during these trying times.

Our most extensive conversation dealt with church reopening. We know many of you desire to worship together again. We know, too, that other churches on the harbor are beginning to reopen, however Pastor Michelle would like to note as of June 30th only one ELCA church in our county and the surrounding 4 counties is open and they are able to do this because of how their building is set up.

Council considered options and concluded that until the state is in Phase 3 or 4, we would be risking the health of our generally older congregation by holding in-person services at this time. For insurance liability, we are required to follow all state guidelines. That means, if we were holding church services in person social distancing, sitting only in household groups, and face masks will be required. In addition, we would probably have to have people sign up to attend per Sunday so that we were following the capacity rules.

The service would look different in many ways. There would be no communion, the only music being allowed would be recorded, and singing along would not be permitted. Following the service, those attending must leave the building immediately with no social hour. And the state is requiring a complete disinfection of the building every time we would hold a service. In addition, worship in the sanctuary at this time might not be possible because of the use of the stairwells and elevator and social distancing requirements. In addition, due to health concerns of the staff and/or their households they would be wearing masks. With these requirements and a concern for the health of

us all, the council voted to keep the building closed in July and reevaluate for August. For more details please see Pastor Michelle's letter in this newsletter about the survey.

Please note that I said the "building" is closed. Church for Saron-First is very much up and running. Pastors Michelle and Jeani are continually adding to our weekly online worship service. The Rose Blast lists opportunities for worship and fellowship. Want to go to the Wednesday morning coffee? Clink on the Zoom link on the Weekly Rose Blast and join us. Don't use the internet? The office is making DVD recordings of worship that they will get to you (along with a DVD player if you do not have one). Please use these opportunities to stay connected. It is not the same, but it is what we have for the time being. That being said, please look after each other. It's a very lonely time for many of us. If you know someone who is needing support, reach out...give a call...put on face masks and take a walk together...and please let the church office know of any special needs.

Our wonderful Lutheran & Presbyterian cooks are prepared to serve our neighbors at the next Community Meal that will take place once we are able to gather again safely.


Union Gospel Mission Dinner
