Summary of Saron Lutheran-1st Presbyterian Church Comprehensive Plan for Outdoor Worship

COVID 19 Control, Mitigation & Recovery Plan

The following is a summary of the plan the Church Council approved on March 18, 2021. We anticipate this plan will change and need updating, therefore each iteration is marked with by version.

General COVID Control and Mitigation Requirements

- Persons with any sign of illness must stay home (including their household). If you have been exposed or have been possibly exposed to a person diagnosed or has symptoms of COVID-19 you must stay home. Please take your temperature before coming. Any person with a temperature above 100.4 degrees should stay home. Saron-1st will have a "no-touch instant-read" thermometer for use of those who haven't checked at home.
- All persons over the age of 2 MUST WEAR A MASK AT ALL TIMES. We will have masks available to people who forget them at home. Anyone who is unwilling to wear a mask will not be allowed to participate or remain.
- We ask all persons must maintain a six-foot clearance from other persons during worship.
- If a person who attends experiences symptoms or tests for COVID-19 within 2 weeks of worship, we ask that you immediately notify Pastor Michelle de Beauchamp or Teri Julian.
- Everyone must sign in with a name and phone number. This document counts as a covenant stating you have done all you can to mitigate the spread of COVID following CDC guidelines (i.e. wearing masks in public places and washing hands frequently), and that you promise to notify us if you are exposed to COVID. In addition, this list will be used by staff to notify the Grays Harbor County Health Department if the attendance is pertinent for them in contact tracing.
- The staff will be setting up and tearing following all COVID-19 cleaning procedures detailed in the comprehensive plan.

- Use of restrooms will be greatly curtailed. The only restroom available is accessed through the doors nearest the parking lot or the front door (for wheelchair access). A bathroom monitor will allow only one person at a time to occupy a restroom. The bathroom will be sanitized after each use.
- **No offering plate will be passed.** We will have a container for offerings on the way out of the area pastor will mention in worship.
- We will remain in our places for the passing of peace. No shaking hands unless your household.
- Communion will happen monthly.
- There will be no fellowship coffee hour after worship.
- WEATHER—RAIN: We encourage people to bring umbrellas. In addition, we will have tent canopies that can be used. During April we will be organizing the front part of the garage to be set up for staff to lead worship from if it looks like rain.
- WEATHER-SMOKE OR STORM: If there are terrible wildfires and/or a big storm and we are not able to safely meet outdoors for worship we will have that morning a pre-recorded worship posted from last year and/or Pastor Michelle will record worship at home and post. All the church would be notified of this via email and posts on social media. Our no internet households would be called directly of this change.

Here is a current list of the teams and list of dates each team is serving. You will see that <u>we can</u> <u>use more volunteers</u>! If you are unsure about whether to volunteer, keep in mind that each team prepares and delivers a meal to the mission <u>only</u> three time a year, just once every four months. (During the Covid crisis, we are no longer serving the meal...just providing it.) The date of the meal is always the third Monday of the month. The meal consists of a main dish (traditionally Tator-Tot Casserole from the Saron cookbook), bread, salad or seasonal fruit, dessert, and beverage (milk and juice). The teams pick a menu and divide up the jobs: 3-4 for main dish, someone for milk/juice, someone for bread, someone for salad, and dessert.
