One of the lesser-known ones "The Parable of Weeds among the Wheat" in Matthew 13 is one I recently came across.

One thing that stood out to me in the parable is the idea that the farmer tells the slave to not uproot the weeds,

But he replied, "No; for in gathering the weeds you would uproot the wheat along with them.

30 Let both of them grow together until the harvest; and at harvest time I will tell the reapers, Collect the weeds first and bind them in bundles to be burned, but gather the wheat into my barn." '- Matthew 13:29-30

Leaving the weeds in the ground and not pulling them out...I feel like that is something to reflect on. The weeds still had a purpose to grow with the wheat, probably in some ways helping the wheat with holding them up, creating the sturdiness of the soil, or maybe protecting the wheat from insects. Once they did separate the weeds from the wheat they were burned, and this actually shows us the weeds at the end of the existence change into a thing of even more use...ash. The weeds being burned made them into a source of heat out there in the fields and after being burned into ash they became a source for nutrients to blend into the soil. A common practice with ash is to add it to soil to help restore nutrient-depleted soil. People can add ash to soil to increase soil fertility and restore PH balance. So in this whole process the weeds still have purpose and can change and cause more growth in the future.

In this time of year when we see things starting to decompose, life cycles coming to an end, we remember still things can change, parts of us we don't like make us who we are and we can grow. From an end, new life can still spring forth. God calls all of creation to be loved and seen as good, even the weeds.

As we enter into our seasonally dark time of year what would it be like if we took this approach? Saw those things we think of as "weeds" as good and with purpose? Saw "weeds" as something with meaning to pushing us to grow? Saw "weeds" as maybe a helper to guide us along in life? What if we stopped and paused and reflected on how Jesus calls us to love all and approach life with love and grace. Peace,



## **Harbor Bounty**

Building community resilience and food sovereignty in Grays Harbor County

Harbor Bounty is a partnership gathering professional Chefs, humanitarians, and the community in Grays Harbor Washington.

#### The services of the partnership

Harvest Bounty wants to offer families living in the food assistance gap empowerment services to build resilience and food security. For this purpose, Saron Lutheran-1st Presbyterian Church and Librairie Gourmande will host families in the food assistance gap for high level, fun, and informative culinary education and food distribution activities. These activities will endeavor to ensure the families are empowered for increased resilience and food security while also freeing their creativity and their imaginations, and finally, fully protecting their dignity as contributing members of the Grays Harbor community.

Our first event on September 27<sup>th</sup> was small but mighty. We learned how to make our own pizza and the kids had a ball. The class will be offered again on October 25<sup>th</sup> from 5:30p-7:30p, and then will be a monthly class starting in January. Register by October 20<sup>th</sup>, 2022, by stopping by at 708 8<sup>th</sup> St, Hoquiam, during our office hours (Mon, Wed, Thu 9am-1pm), or by calling us at 360-532-4611 and leaving a message if we are not there. We will call you back as soon as we are able. There is a simple form to fill out with very basic information. What an exciting new ministry!

### **Fall Sunday School**

Sunday School is every Sunday! The Sunday school is for all ages under 6th grade, and older kids can be helpers. We have been following the Whirl curriculum that teaches Bible stories and connects it to kids' daily lives. We even have a short cartoon for each class to watch and tons of fun activities. Sunday school happens after the readings and choir performance. The kids come to worship and are dismissed downstairs for Sunday School to meet back up with their families for fellowship after worship.

### **Bible Study**

Our Bible Study this Fall is on the Book of Revelation from the Bible. This will be a ten-week study, on Wednesdays at 11:30am-12:30pm from September 16 - November 16. Have you ever been scared about the end times? Confused about what popular culture says versus the Bible? Are you curious about this last book of the Bible? If so, this class is for you! Revelation is a book about hope, transformation, and change. So much of what we learn in our wider culture (i.e., the Left Behind series and more) are cultural and historical interpretations not biblically grounded. We will be using the Bible in this study and the excellent book by Barbara R. Rossing titled "The Rapture Exposed: The Message of Hope in the Book of Revelation." Bring a Bible (or borrow one from the church) and we have copies of the Rossing book for people. If we get more than 12 people, we will order some more! See you there!

#### **Centering Prayer Time Tuesdays at the Rose Center**

Tuesdays starting on October 18th at 9:30am we will have a centering prayer for a half hour each week. During this time Pastor Michelle will share with us about different ancient forms of prayer (i.e., centering prayer, lectio divina, breath prayer, meditation etc.) and we will practice it as a group. This will meet in person and will also be live streamed on our Facebook for people to join in or participate at a later time.

#### **Drop-In Grief Group Tuesdays at the Rose Center**

The first drop-in group is October 18th at 10am at the Rose Center. We are relaunching our grief group ministry here at Saron-1st. With the holiday season on the horizon, and all the losses many of us have experienced these past years, we are starting our "drop-in" grief support group. This is a safe space to share, listen, and support one another in our grief. All are welcome to join in no matter the loss and you do not have to be a church member or a Christian to come and join us.

Please note, our 10-week workshops for widow/widowers will begin in January 2023 so look for the sign up in the next couple of months.

#### **Famous Last Words Sermon Series**

Did you know that Reformation Sunday kicks off the end of our church calendar year? Did you know that some of the ends of the books of the Bible actually feel like beginnings? Pastor Michelle was asked to write and be published as part of the sermon/prayer series called "Famous Last Words" for the magazine Fedelia, which is the magazine of Young Clergy Women International (YCWI). This series was put together for churches to use internationally to think through ends and beginnings of our own lives, books of the Bible, and the church year. We still will be celebrating our high holidays (Reformation, All Saints), but this year in worship we will be reflecting and pondering it through this lens of "famous last words." Sometimes when a chapter closes another one opens...with God there is not ending.

After worship on October 30th the youth kids will have a pizza party in the Fireside Room and then head out to Chapman Farms in Montesano (239 Brady Loop RD E Montesano) with the families for some pumpkin patch fun!
