

Harbor Bounty

Building community resilience and food sovereignty in Grays Harbor County

Harbor Bounty is a partnership gathering professional Chefs, humanitarians, and the community in Grays Harbor Washington.

In response to need, and for the purpose of increasing community resilience and food sovereignty, our goal is to lengthen the food sharing and food knowledge tables in Grays Harbor County.

We want to ensure that families in need can readily access food and/or food knowledge without socio-economic or cultural barriers.

We want to empower our community to be hunger free so that the true bounty of our people, seas, forests, farms, and ranches can be realized for the sustainable future of Grays Harbor.

The core partnership

Families in the food assistance gap

The working poor are feeling more and more the effects of inflation and the economic downturn. Even with two incomes, families that do not fulfill the standard criteria for food assistance are struggling to ensure the provision of adequate food quality and quantity.



Saron Lutheran-1st Presbyterian Church

Saron Lutheran-1st Presbyterian Church is a church with 501c3 nonprofit status located in Hoquiam, WA. We are part of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of America (ELCA) and Presbyterian Church U.S.A. (PCUSA) denominations.

Our mission statement is: As one united congregation, we stand as a beacon of hope in Grays Harbor, by sharing God's message of love through acts of service, outreach, education, and worship. Through multiple programs (i.e., the community garden, hygiene kits, grief groups, space for Al-Anon meetings) we support our neighbors throughout the Grays Harbor area by providing physical, mental, and spiritual support.



Librairie Gourmande is a sole proprietorship based in Grays Harbor County. Stephanie Diakité, JC-JD/MBA/PhD is the owner and principal Chef. Librairie Gourmande works in the area of human rights and food, notably in developing positive socio-cultural and economic outcomes driven by food sharing and knowledge building at the community level. Operations in Grays Harbor County were initiated in 2020 when the owner and principal Chef built a world class commercial kitchen and culinary event space in Hoquiam and began teaching cooking classes for families and individuals. The activities have grown since that time to include food and culinary education activities in support of humanitarian, public education, and justice institutions in Grays Harbor County.

The services of the partnership

Harvest Bounty wants to offer families living in the food assistance gap empowerment services to build resilience and food security. For this purpose, Saron Lutheran-1st Presbyterian Church and Librairie Gourmande will host families in the food assistance gap for high level, fun, and informative culinary education and food distribution activities. These activities will endeavor to ensure the families are empowered for increased resilience and food security while also freeing their creativity and their imaginations, and finally, fully protecting their dignity as contributing members of the Grays Harbor community.



What's Happening at Saron-1st

Fall Sunday School

Sunday School is beginning on Sunday, September 11th! The Sunday school is for all ages under 6th grade, and older kids can be helpers. We will be following the cool and fun Whirl curriculum that teaches Bible stories and connects it to kids' daily lives. We even have a short cartoon for each class to watch and tons of fun activities. Sunday school happens during part of the worship service. The kids come to worship and are dismissed downstairs for Sunday School and come back up when they are done. We already have a few people signed up to teach. Please let Pastor Michelle know if you can be one of our teachers. It is an easy curriculum to follow, and we will have it set up for teachers to walk in and be able to lead it.

Bible Study

Our Bible Study this Fall will be on the Book of Revelation from the Bible. This will be a ten-week study, on Wednesdays at 11:30am-12:30pm from September 16 - November 16. Have you ever been scared about the end times? Confused about what popular culture says versus the Bible? Are you curious about this last book of the Bible? If so, this class is for you! Revelation is a book about hope, transformation, and change. So much of what we learn in our wider culture (i.e., the Left Behind series and more) are cultural and historical interpretations not biblically grounded. We will be using the Bible in this study and the excellent book by Barbara R. Rossing titled "The Rapture Exposed: The Message of Hope in the Book of Revelation." Bring a Bible (or borrow one from the church) and we have copies of the Rossing book for people. If we get more than 12 people, we will order some more! See you there!
