Dear Church,

Happy Thanksgiving! Happy Advent! Advent is here! The beginning of the church year and our journey over 4 weeks to Christmas Eve is finally here! Advent means the arrival of a notable person or event by definition, but I think we could even expand that meaning. Advent means an arrival, but to arrive you must first be on a journey and that journey has a beginning and a destination. Advent is like a road trip.

The first Sunday of Advent is when we decorate the church and the Christmas tree at Saron-1st. It is like we are preparing for our journey– like packing the car– hey don't forget your coat and shoes or that shiny ribbon! So, the church is dressed and prepared for the journey. And we begin with the expectation of our drive toward our destination...Christmas. The birth of Immanuel/Emmanuel. The messiah is finally journeying to us and coming to earth.

The tradition of an Advent wreath when we see what "advent" means and expand our ideas of it makes more sense. We light a candle weekly in church as a sign of hope and waiting, and yet also a light guiding us on our trip to Bethlehem. It is like the headlights of our car when traveling on a road trip, or a stop along the way marking we are only a quarter or half of the way there.

The map we are following (or google map on our phones) on our Advent road trip to Christmas are the texts from the Bible which inspire and are written into our hymns/carols. Carols like "O Come O Come Emmanuel" reference the imagery of the Old Testament biblical texts pointing us to the messiah. One of the most influential pieces of scripture in pointing us to Jesus is Isaiah 9:2-7:

- 2 The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness—on them light has shined.
- 3 You have multiplied the nation, you have increased its joy; they rejoice before you as with joy at the harvest, as people exult when dividing plunder.
- 4 For the yoke of their burden, and the bar across their shoulders, the rod of their oppressor, you have broken as on the day of Midian.
- 5 For all the boots of the tramping warriors and all the garments rolled in blood shall be burned as fuel for the fire.
- 6 For a child has been born for us, a son given to us;
- authority rests upon his shoulders; and he is named
- Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.
- 7 His authority shall grow continually, and there shall be endless peace for the throne of David and his kingdom. He will establish and uphold it with justice and with righteousness
- with justice and with righteousness
 from this time onwards and for evermore.

This passage for millennia has influenced our carols, art, writings, and more for all humankind. It was the map given to the prophet Isaiah hundreds of years before Christ. It is a map guiding us on our road trip to Bethlehem. And it not only guides us but inspired the carol "O Come O Come Emmanuel" that we sing a verse of during the lighting of the Advent wreath in worship. So pause and think for a moment about this road trip...we have prepared (dressed up the tree), we have a map guiding us (scripture and music), and we safely light the way with our car headlights (i.e. Advent wreath or light). Are you prepared for our Advent journey? Are you ready to jump in the car with us and get going on this wonderful journey to Christmas? You are invited. Come and join in and center your heart and mind on the true meaning of Christmas. Come there is always room for you.

Listening with the Spirit is a formation preparation for people who have been in spiritual direction and wish to become a spiritual director. The Priory Spirituality Center offers a two-year program on Zoom: Year 1 has 24 sessions which begin on 9-20-23 and end on 4-17-24. Year 2 has 24 sessions which begin on 9-10-24 and end on 4-30-25.
