Dear Church,

However, with the holidays upon us sometimes our hearts can ache and long for our loved ones that have passed. Grief can come upon us anytime, even if it is decades since a loved one has died. This is why I really cherish the church tradition of All Saints Sunday. It was something I did not grow up with as a youth, but since my late twenties I look forward to every year.

I remember going to a historical cathedral as a kid and lighting a candle to remember my grandfather, even though we were not Catholic my mom said it was fine. In cathedrals there are side areas called chapels that are for personal reflection and prayer. I remember that first time, at 13 years old, kneeling down and lighting a candle to honor my Presbyterian Scottish grandfather. The warm glow of the candle bounced off the stone walls of the chapel and made me think of Christmas Eve candle lighting in my home church. I said a little prayer of thanks and remembrance while I kneeled in that chapel. Suddenly, I felt a warm hug had enveloped me and calm descended on my heart.

Those few sacred minutes in the church, looking at that candle, fostered a deep connection with my faith. It allowed space for me as a kid to feel grief, but also to connect that I would see my grandpa again in heaven. As I write these words to all of you the phrase Jesus utters from the cross floated into my brain, "Truly I tell you, today you will be with me in paradise." Our loved ones are in paradise while simultaneously walking alongside us in our memories and hearts. We will see them again. Jesus says these words to the criminal dying alongside him. This always reminds me that God is one of love, grace, and compassion.

Remembering our loved ones that have passed through worship services like All Saints creates space to remember, grieve, honor, respect, HOPE, and love. I find the service to be such an authentic worship where we really name our human experience of loss, grief, and death. When we enter into that space with God and allow our hearts to feel and our minds to remember, Jesus meets us right there in our grief. Jesus meets us and calls us to remember that they are with him in paradise. That we will meet them again.

So as you gather this month around tables celebrating harvest, community, and giving thanks it is totally normal to feel a little grief when the memories flood back of your loved ones not here on this earth anymore. It is totally OK to simultaneously feel sad and yet happy. I just encourage you to give yourself some space and grace. Create this space for yourself can be done in many different ways, but here are some suggestions: 1) to participate in worships that remember and allow that space (i.e. All Saints and Blue Christmas); 2) to be open and honest with your loved ones and share those memories; 3) to come to grief group or make a pastoral care appointment; 4) to light a candle at home to honor them. We all are experiencing grief in a variety of ways in this world, and your grief is valid. And remember the promise in Jesus that we will see our loved ones again.
