Through the end of 2018 an into early 2019 the mutual ministry team (Carrie Larson and Sue Varland) helped me develop and apply for a highly competitive national sabbatical grant from the Lily Foundation called the Lily Foundation Clergy Renewal Program <a href="https://lillyendowment.org/for-grantseekers/renewal-programs/">https://lillyendowment.org/for-grantseekers/renewal-programs/</a>). The point of this grant is to help fund clergy sabbaticals for research in areas that will renew them and their congregations. The main theme of the grant we wrote was to connect directly into the development of our new ministries at The Rose Center regarding spiritual formation and retreat. The theme for this research and renewal grant I was awarded for 2020 (and postponed due to COVID) is: *Pilgrimage of the Soul and Body through Prayer: connecting today's church with ancient rituals and modern forms of prayer to restore the spirit through Celtic spiritual practices (walking, spiraling, and labyrinth prayer) and other* 

*lighting candles).* Now even in 2023 after COVID and everything this theme is still relevant for our church. We as a church still are miraculously experiencing growth in our ministries and membership! This is not what many other mainline churches nationally are experiencing. We are a small, but very active church. And burnout can happen for all. This renewal is allowing space to explore and reflect on how we can sustainably expand our ministries specifically in areas of spiritual growth, while also making a shift of asking what spiritual support and focus our neighborhood and community needs. Dear good people of Saron Lutheran-1<sup>st</sup> Presbyterian Church,

My name is Beth Utto-Galarneau. I am co-pastor of St. Mark Lutheran Church in Lacey, WA, and Dean of the South Sound Conference of the Southwest Washington Synod. I served on the Harbor for 10 years at Amazing Grace and am a friend of Pastor Michelle de Beauchamp.

I am writing to thank you for offering Pastor Michelle a sabbatical this year. The Southwest Washington Synod Compensation Guidelines for Rostered Clergy and Deacons recommends congregations grant a 12-week sabbatical leave to their pastor after each 5 years of service to the congregation. The reasons are many. Pastors work long hours. We do a wide variety of tasks—we are preachers, teachers, counselors, administrators, coordinators, coffee makers, toilet fixers, and more. We are on call at all times. Our busiest times are also times that our culture associates with "family time"—evenings, weekends, and holidays. Even when we are very intentional, it can be difficult to carve out regular time off for rest and renewal because life happens, and we are here for you in times of sorrow, crisis, and joy.

The average length of a pastoral call in the ELCA is 3.6 years. Most often a pastoral transition is initiated by the pastor. I know from my own experiences and the experiences of colleagues; it is hard to sustain the regular pace of life as a parish pastor. Many pastors transition to new calls because a change in this pace is needed. A sabbatical provides this change in pace for pastor and congregations without the major disruption of a change in pastoral leadership. Sabbaticals give permission to not only slow down, but also to renew.

As a pastor who took her first full sabbatical in 2018 after 25 years of ordained ministry, I can affirm, this time for rest and renewal is life-giving—not only for pastors, but also for congregations. We all need times and spaces to breathe deep the life-giving breath of God, but we don't always know how to do that in the midst of everything else we do. Sabbaticals offer this holy time and sacred space. This is their primary purpose. For me, one of the greatest gifts of my sabbatical was that I remembered who I am—not just as a pastor, but also as a person. I was able to step aside from my regular pastoral duties and immerse myself in being me—a mom, a wife, a daughter, a sibling, a friend, an artist, a learner, an explorer, a loved child of God. Upon my return from sabbatical, this also made me a better pastor. Healthier pastors and healthier congregations go hand in hand. The best sabbaticals not only offer time and space to clergy but also to the congregation.

As you prepare for your sabbatical in mid-August, please keep this holy time in your prayers. Pray for Pastor Michelle to be able to step aside from her regular pastoral duties so she can rest and renew. Also, contemplate how you, the people of Saron, will take time for rest and renewal as you are offering this gift to Pastor Michelle? And as you come back together in Advent, how will you celebrate this reunion and share your experiences?

Thank you for offering Pastor Michelle this sacred time. I pray for her and her family and I pray for you as you prepare for this holy journey of rest and renewal together.

# And you are to love those who are foreigners, for you yourselves were foreigners in Egypt. <u>Deuteronomy 10:19</u>



The definition of foreigner is a person not belonging to a particular place or group, a stranger or outsider. Haven't we all felt like a foreigner at one point in time, or currently feel that way - as an outsider. We invite you to join us as we care for those who feel this way!

While LCSNW has a wide spectrum of services, one to highlight is our newly branded Safe Route Immigration program. Safe Route Immigration, a program of Lutheran Community Services Northwest, provides accessible legal services to refugees and immigrants in Portland, Beaverton, McMinnville, and Salem, Oregon, along with Vancouver, Tacoma, and Seattle, Washington. We're committed to growing alongside our clients and have expanded our services over the past four decades to include immigrant rights advocacy, community education, and legal guidance for clients on their journey to becoming fully integrated members of American society.
