September 28-October 5 Cotswolds Area UK

Pilgrimage in the Cotswolds and the Salisbury Plain: Visiting the Celtic and religious pilgrimage sites and routes such as: Tewkesbury Abbey, St. Edward's, the ancient Aquae Sulis Way route (ends at Bath Abbey) **and more.** Learning on the Salisbury Plain about the pre-Christian faiths influence of Celtic Christianity. (Avebury and Sarum).

October 5-9 Bath, UK

A Pilgrimage to Bath: Visit Bath's museums, gallery, Jane Austen Centre and go on a walking tour to learn about the city and how it connects to wellness and care. This is to provide context of Roman influence on Celtic Christianity.

October 9-12 Winchester and Canterbury, UK

The Pilgrim's Way and Canterbury: Driving the road from Winchester to Canterbury Cathedral. This is one of the most famous pilgrimage sites in the United Kingdom. And staying in Canterbury and walking part of the Pilgrim's Way in town.

October 12-16 London, UK

London, UK: Visit museums, cathedrals, and churches.

October 16-18 Chartres, France

Pilgrimage to Chartres, France: Visit and walk the famous pilgrimage site and the labyrinth at Chartres Cathedral.

October 18-23 Amboise, France

Visiting Pilgrimage Sites in the Loire Valley of France (only 1.5 hours from Chartres): Fontevraud Abbey, Trinity Abbey (Vendome), Tours, Blois and more.


October 23-28 Paris, France


























- 10-8-23 *Rejoice! Or Practicing Joy:* Pastor Beth Utto-Galarneau of St. Mark's in Lacey, is unable to serve us on this day, so has graciously "filled her spot" with Pastor Brenda Satrum. According to Pastor Beth, Pastor Brenda is a skilled and compassionate spiritual director and a caring, wise pastor. Pastor Brenda serves as Pastor of Spiritual Formation at First Lutheran Church in Shelton, WA.
- 10-15-23 *Yoga/Movement/Exercise as Prayer/Pilgrimage:* This is a traditional worship led by Rev. Dr. Amanda Kersey that will reflect on how in our bodies we can embody prayer and pilgrimage...like ancient prayer practices.
- 10-22-23 *What is a Pilgrimage?:* Special speaker and presider for worship is Bishop Rick Jaech of the Southwestern Washington Synod. He has traveled many pilgrimage routes and will share those experiences.
- 10-29-23 *Joyful Music Worship:* Pilgrimage with Music and Also Pilgrimage through Art at Holden. This is a singing Sunday led by Music Director Kari Hasbrouck and Choir Director Troy George. This is Reformation Sunday and will be a joyous occasion and celebration. Church member Carrie Larson will be sharing about her time as an artist-in-residence at Holden Village.
- 11-5-23 What is a Pilgrimage: The idea of pilgrimage, retreat, and renewal will be led by Chaplain and Pastor Tammy Stampfil. Rev. Stampfil will also share about her time in the Holy Land.
- 11-12-23 *Hopes for the Future:* A traditional service led by Council President Ruth Hamilton and Treasurer Tony Enzler, anticipating the sabbatical's conclusion with hopes for the future
- 11-19-23 What is a Pilgrimage?: Native American Celebration Sunday. Rev. Linda Smith will lead worship to celebrate Native American Celebration Sunday. She will share from her Native American perspective the idea of pilgrimage and spiritual journeys.
