There are wars and conflicts happening still in Ukraine, Gaza, Israel, and even close by in Haiti. How can we ask, live, and believe in peace when there is so much violence and hate? And what really is peace?

Peace in the Bible comes from the Hebrew word "shalom" and it was used as a greeting when arriving or leaving. Shalom/Peace in the Bible means, "right relationship with God, creation, and one another." It is about finding wholeness and connection in all of life. And peace in the Bible goes hand in hand with justice. Shalom only happens when all are in right relationship- and that means all are treated with kindness, equity, and equality.

Peace is well-being in all relationships. The best description of this kind of peace our United Methodist friends wrote in their Peace and Justice documents from 2016:

"At the heart of the Old Testament is the testimony to shalom, that marvelous Hebrew word that means peace. But the peace that is shalom is not negative or one-dimensional. It is much more than the absence of war. Shalom is positive peace: harmony, wholeness, health, and well-being in all human relationships. It is the natural state of humanity as birthed by God. It is harmony between humanity and all of God's good creation. All of creation is interrelated. Every creature, every element, every force of nature participates in the whole of creation. If any person is denied shalom, all are thereby diminished."

As a pastor of over a decade I would even expand this to not just be in a right relationship with others but also with oneself. How can you be kinder to your neighbor and (what is harder for many) yourself? How can one show peace and grace to all. We are called to find that peace inwardly and show it outwardly in this world. And through Christ peace is possible. Now knowing that the resurrection happened on that Easter morning and the loving power of God, the power of the words Jesus spoke to the disciples before the passion are powerful to review after going through Easter. Jesus before all of the Holy Week happenings happened sat with the disciples and said to them, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid."

Peace be with you this season. May relationships be restored in your life. May well-being and harmony be experienced. And may the peace of God expand and grow unhardening the hearts of those in power that cause pain, conflict, and war.





### A Reading from Matthew 6:25-34 to Reflect On:

Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink; or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothes? <sup>26</sup> Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not much more valuable than they? <sup>27</sup> Can any one of you by worrying add a single hour to your life<sup>[e]</sup>? <sup>28</sup> "And why do you worry about clothes? See how the flowers of the field grow. They do not labor or spin. <sup>29</sup> Yet I tell you that not even Solomon in all his splendor was dressed like one of these. <sup>30</sup> If that is how God clothes the grass of the field, which is here today and tomorrow is thrown into the fire, will he not much more clothe you—you of little faith? <sup>31</sup> So do not worry, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?' 32 For the pagans run after all these things, and your heavenly Father knows that you need them. <sup>33</sup> But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well. <sup>34</sup> Therefore do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about itself.
