And we start October with our last Sunday during the Season of Creation. On October 6th we will be celebrating St. Francis Day/Harvest Sunday. What a wonderful way to end this 6week celebration! We have worked together at the Rose Center, learned about caring for creation as part of our call to be disciples, blessed the important creatures in our lives, and praised God for the gift of creation. Thank you to all who participated in this lovely ongoing season. We have two more weeks to come and join us!

Autumn is a beautiful season of seeing change all around us. Imagine our ancestors who worked in fields or at least were more aware of the changing of the seasons in their daily lives. People they knew would be finishing up gathering the harvest in the fields and preparing for the holiday season and winter. Some of us still do this kind of preparation, maybe some skills that have been passed down, like canning, storing, preserving things or *Continued...* tending our gardens. Or maybe you just go to a pumpkin patch, the Farmstand, or Safeway to get a pumpkin to mark the change in the season.

Last year on St. Francis Sunday my family of 3 were blessed enough to be in a small village in the Cotswolds. On that Sunday in the UK the Church of England calls it "Harvest Festival Sunday." That Sunday is when all the churches across England celebrate by playing their bells like a concert in the morning.

We were joyfully woken up by them by the little parish church of St. Edward's. The church bells played their music for almost an hour to remind all the village about the change of the season. Listening to them pealing over the square and noticing the changing of the autumn leaves made me ponder the scripture from Matthew 6,

And why do you worry about clothes? See how the flowers of the field grow. They do not labor or spin. Yet I tell you that not even Solomon in all his splendor was dressed like one of these...therefore do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own.

Looking out and seeing the beauty of the season changing and hearing those bells caused me to pause and give thanks to God right in the moment. Thank you for joining us in this Season of Creation. I hope it inspired you to be more aware of creation, care for creation, and to pause and give thanks for the gift of creation from God. As we enter this transition time of Autumn to Fall to Winter...this is a time, we can pause. In this pause we can give thanks to God and reflect on how we see God moving in our lives and the world. We will be holding some more reflection times these next two months. I invite each of you to pause in preparing for winter and busyness of life. We will be having special Sunday worship services during this time, an Election Day Vigil Service over the lunch hour, Centering Time on Tuesdays, a Pre-Holiday Centering Retreat on November 19th and more. And some good news...

As of right now, it looks like we will get our own bells to peal in Hoquiam again by Christmas. That means we too will be able to- like that little village in England- will be marking the important occasions and changes in the season here in Hoquiam.




