We hope that you have had a wonderful beginning to the new year. 2024 held some major obstacles, however there is so much growth in our congregation and in our ministries. Because of YOU and your faith, we can gather together for worship and all our other church ministries. Thank you for your continued support of Saron Lutheran-1st Presbyterian Church.

We are a resilient congregation. Yes, the church was struck by lightning in November, but the miracle is we protected our community; and our community showed up for us. This setback did not stop us from continuing our ministries in Grays Harbor.

Our Church helped and impacted THOUSANDS of people in the Grays Harbor area throughout the year. Ways we do this are: growing produce in our community garden, our monthly community meals ministry, hosting the weekly Harbor Food Pantry, hosting and being part of the Boots for Bears Committee, supporting local organizations (i.e. the Hoquiam Food and Clothing Bank, Union Gospel Mission, Chaplains on the Harbor, and the Hoquiam School District), our ongoing cold weather/hygiene drives/gift cards for youth, and more. Well done good and faithful servants! In addition, we are growing in our worship ministries, youth ministry, and in our membership.

God's Light based on John 1:5 which says, "A light shines in the darkness and the darkness did not overcome it." God is that light in our gloomy world and we are called to share that light with all. Our church mission statement calls us to be a "beacon of hope in Grays Harbor", living out our mission of faithfully serving God and our neighbors. Join us to see the direct positive impact in our church and community when we share from our abundance. The Save Saron Campaign for the building went really well in 2024, and we are still waiting for the insurance claim on the steeple to go through. This year we will be modernizing the elevator, which approximately will cost \$40,000. Please consider increasing your tithe to the general fund for this year.

Now is the time to give thanks to God for the strength of spirit of Saron-1st and to cheerfully give with a thankful heart so our ministries may continue. 

Assisting Minister Schedule

We have an Assisting Minister Binder that is available for you to sign up to assist at worship service on Sundays and special services. This Binder is available in the Center Hall on the table.

Lector: Reads the 1 or 2 readings that will be posted on the lectern.

Usher: Preps Worship space with candle lighting, hymn numbers, unlocks all doors & double checks elevator.

Hands out bulletins to incoming parishioners.

Sits in the back of the Sanctuary to oversee the service.

Walks the aisle with donation plate during the offering.

Records congregation count and collects tithes from offering plate.

After worship – lock main doors, blow out candles & turn off lights.

Attendance Record slip and all tithes are put in bank bag & given to Pastor or Teri.

Greeter: Stands in narthex to greet incoming parishioners and makes newcomers feel welcome.

Altar Guild: Preparation & clean-up of communion wine & bread This position is assigned. If you cannot make it on the day you are scheduled, please contact another Altar Guild or the office.


Communion Asst: Delivers the wine during Communion.

Altar Flowers: Brings flowers for the altar vases & arranges them before worship.

Fellowship Host: Set-up and clean-up for fellowship. Makes coffee & tea, brings goodies.

(If help is needed with the coffee pot, just ask)
Teams are set-up and assigned. Contact your team members if you are
not available on the day your team is scheduled.

Sunday School: Leads the Sunday School lesson for that day. Schedule made quarterly. If you would like to teach the kids, please contact the office for the Safe Space Policy and a background check.
