





Assisting Minister Schedule

We have an Assisting Minister Binder that is available for you to sign up to assist at worship service on Sundays and special services. This Binder is available in Moller Hall on the table.

Lector: Reads the 1 or 2 readings that will be posted on the lectern.

Usher: Preps Worship space with candle lighting, hymn numbers, unlocks all doors & double checks elevator (when operational).

Hands out bulletins to incoming parishioners. Sits in the back of the Sanctuary to oversee the service.

Walks the aisle with donation plate during the offering.

Records congregation count and collects tithes from offering plate.

After worship – lock main doors, blow out candles & turn off lights.

Attendance Record slip and all tithes are put in bank bag & given to Pastor or Teri.

Greeter: Stands in narthex to greet incoming parishioners and makes newcomers feel welcome.

Altar Guild: Preparation & clean-up of communion wine & bread

This position is assigned. If you cannot make it on the day you are scheduled, please contact another Altar Guild or the office.

Communion Asst: Delivers the wine during Communion.

Altar Flowers: Brings flowers for the altar vases & arranges them before worship.

Fellowship Host: Set-up and clean-up for fellowship. Makes coffee & tea, brings goodies.

(If help is needed with the coffee pot, just ask) Teams are set-up and assigned. Contact your team members if you are not available on the day your team is scheduled.

Sunday School: Leads the Sunday School lesson for that day. Schedule made quarterly. If you would like to teach the kids, please contact the office for the Safe Space Policy and a background check.

Training is available for all positions!

Dear friends,

I invite you to join me in supporting refugee families who have arrived in the United States sponsored by Lutheran Community Services Northwest and our Synod congregations. These refugee families, many from Afghanistan and Somalia, were granted legal permission to come to the US and were promised support and assistance for the first three months. However, they suddenly find themselves in a very difficult situation.



On January 20, a presidential executive order was issued that ended the Congress-approved refugee program and froze the funding that assists sponsored refugees who are already in the US. Faced with this sudden crisis, our Synod congregations who are sponsoring refugees have been working diligently to provide housing, furniture, food, and loving encouragement. With generous spirits, they have provided far more resources than they were originally asked to give. However, they need and deserve our help!

For this reason, we have initiated a Refugee Support Project.

Our first goal is to raise \$8,000 to provide adequate housing and financial support for the sponsored refugees in the coming months as they get settled. We already have raised \$2,000, with \$1,500 coming from our Synod's Disaster Rapid Response Fund, and \$500 contributed by a Synod member. I invite you to join me in making a gift to the Refugee Support Project so that we can raise \$6,000 more.

Our second goal is to join with the other five synods in ELCA Region 1 to form a Region 1 Immigrant Support Team. Lutherans throughout our region are wanting to be supportive of individuals and families who come to us as refugees, asylum seekers and immigrants. Our Region 1 Immigrant Support Team will coordinate our efforts to provide support to refugees and immigrants in our area in a variety of ways, including support with job

search, getting settled in new homes, and providing legal information for congregations who are serving the immigrant community. An example of this was the "Know Your Rights" online seminar that the Region 1 bishops provided in February.

As we approach Holy Week and give thanks for the life, death, and resurrection of Christ, may we be moved to join Christ in doing the life-giving work of God in the world.
