This Advent we will be reflecting on what it means to wait—and to remain rooted during transitions. Waiting is difficult for most of us. We like to see things moving forward and know the path that lies ahead. But just because we cannot see the path ahead does not mean that nothing is happening. Like a seed that needs time to swell and root itself deep in the ground before it can sprout through the dirt, it may be a while before we see what God is growing through the seeds he has planted at Saron-First. Yet, if we stay connected to what God is doing in the soil beneath us, we allow the roots of God's seeds to strengthen and grow and flourish through us.

The Advent season reminds us that God's greatest work often happens in hiddenness and waiting. Mary carried God's promise for all of creation for nine months before the world could behold the infant Jesus. The prophets waited generations for the fulfillment of God's covenant. And we, like those faithful witnesses before us, are called to trust that God is at work even when we cannot yet see the fullness of what He is bringing to birth.

This Advent, may we rest in the assurance that the same God who brought forth the promised seed by becoming human and dwelling among us is faithful to complete the good work that has begun in us and through us at Saron-First.

Church Council Update

Dear Church – some of you may have questions about how things are moving along on various fronts, so here is a status report:

Transitional Pastor – we have entered into a one-year contract with Rev. Lisa Woicik (PCUSA) to serve as Transitional Pastor. Pastor Lisa has been on board about a month and has moved into the parsonage. In addition to pastoral duties, she will be working with us to assess the needs of the congregation and will work with the Call Committee as we begin the search for a settled pastor.

Call Committee – the members of this committee are LouJean O'Brien, Callie White, Elicia Enzler, John Rhodes, Glen Thompson and Randall Daugherty. The committee will begin regular meetings in January. Please keep them in prayer, as well as Pastor Lisa and our future pastor, that God will clearly guide them in discerning His will for our church.

Building Repairs – The West Wall work is complete. The wall was rebuilt, sheathed in metal cladding and the stained-glass window repaired and re-seated, including storm coverings. It looks wonderful! Insurance payments for damages from last year's lightning strike have been received, totaling \$377,981.03. The old section of the building has been completely rewired. Invoices for all of the work completed to date have been paid. The steeple has been examined by a structural engineer, and plans have been made for its restoration. Lupo Construction did not have space in their schedule to do the repairs this Fall, so the work will be rescheduled in the Spring. In the meantime, insurance reimbursements have been invested in Money Market accounts to gain interest while we wait. These funds are almost enough to cover the steeple rebuild. The two small stained-glass windows in the steeple have been removed by Unique Art Glass for repair. The copper top for the steeple has been completed and is on display in Anderson Hall. Next, an electrical grounding system must be designed and fabricated for installation in the steeple. Fundraising will be needed to cover the cost of this system. The old steeple did not

contain one. We have been informed by our insurance company that continuation of coverage will require this system. The front entry doors to the sanctuary have been restored by Mark Johnson. They look amazing.

Elevator - After multiple phone calls, emails and even personal visits, we learned that the company office is only staffed from 6:30-7:00am. We also learned that a waiver letter from the State is needed by the elevator company for a work authorization. The waiver letter has been requested, but schedule is unknown.

Royal Estate – James & Barbara Royal bequeathed their estate to the church. This included their home, its contents, their truck and bank accounts. All financial assets have been transferred into an estate account. The truck title has been transferred to the church, and it has been licensed and insured. The ramp in front of the house was donated to the Polson Museum. Tools, kitchen gear, a freezer and lawn equipment were moved to the Rose Center. Usable furniture without sales value was donated to others. A yard sale raised \$2,200 and eBay sales have generated \$250 to date. The church is paying ongoing expenses related to the building. A short-term month-to-month tenant is currently residing in the house, providing cleaning and upkeep in addition to rent, offsetting some of the costs. A building analysis has been conducted, and the property will soon be listed for sale. All proceeds from the building sale will go to the estate account and upon finalization will be transferred to the church.

Rose Center – repairs to the roof have been completed. A local painting company has volunteered to paint the exterior of the building. Colors have been selected, and the cost of the paint has been donated. This work will be done in the Spring. The Girl Scouts have taken on mowing the Rose Center lawn as a thank you for their meeting space.

Procedure Manuals – during the last few months, Bailey Cavender has written Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) manuals for each major area of church operations. She has worked with Pastor Michelle, Teri Julian and Pastor Lisa to establish clear information and instructions

for committees and individuals so that anyone coming into a position knows procedures and protocols.

Your church council is here for you. If you have questions or concerns, do not hesitate to talk to us. We are humbled to be part of this church family, and we want to do our best to serve God and our community.
